TERMS & CONDITIONS**



TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Programme

- 1.1. SG International Marathon Pte Ltd ("**SGIM**") is the organiser of the **2026 BYD Singapore International Marathon presented by adidas**, currently scheduled to take place from 4 to 6 December 2026, or such other name, date or format as SGIM may notify from time to time (the "**Event**").
- 1.2. The Event is appointing eligible runners ("**Medic Runners**") to participate in the SGIM Medic Runners Programme as an additional race-day safety support initiative.
- 1.3. Medic Runners are not a substitute for SGIM's appointed medical provider, professional medical personnel, ambulance services, event officials or emergency services. Medic Runners are intended to provide basic first-aid assistance within the limits of their training, certification, qualifications and the race-day protocols issued by SGIM.

2. Term

- 2.1. The Medic Runner's participation shall commence on the date this document is signed and shall continue until 31 December 2026, unless ended earlier by SGIM or the Medic Runner in accordance with these Terms and Conditions.
- 2.2. Participation does not automatically renew. Participation in any future edition of the Event shall be subject to SGIM's approval.
- 2.3. If the Event date, format, route, race schedule, medical plan, deployment plan or operational requirements change, SGIM may notify the Medic Runner of corresponding changes to the Medic Runners Programme, training requirements, deployment, reporting time, reporting location, equipment requirements, communication channels, race-day protocols or other programme requirements.

3. Status of Medic Runner

- 3.1. The Medic Runner participates as a registered race participant accepted into a special Medic Runner programme category.
- 3.2. Nothing in this document creates any employment, contractor, agency, partnership, joint venture, fiduciary or representative relationship between SGIM and the Medic Runner. The Medic Runner shall not hold themselves out as an employee, contractor, agent, representative, doctor, nurse, paramedic or appointed medical provider of SGIM unless separately and expressly engaged by SGIM in writing in such capacity.

4. Eligibility

- 4.1. The Medic Runner confirms that they:
 - (a) are at least 21 years old on race day;

- (b) hold valid CPR + AED and Basic First-Aid certification, or are a qualified healthcare professional and/or EMS professional, and will complete the required certification or training before race day;
- (c) have previous race participation and completion experience relevant to their selected race category;
- (d) have completed a 10km, half marathon or marathon within 18 months prior to application and are physically fit to participate in the selected race category while carrying out Medic Runner duties; and
- (e) have provided true, accurate and complete information to SGIM.

5. Application and Selection

- 5.1. Submission of an application does not guarantee acceptance into the Medic Runners Programme. SGIM may accept, reject, waitlist, reassign or remove any applicant at its sole discretion, including where SGIM considers that the applicant does not meet the programme requirements, operational requirements or safety requirements.
- 5.2. SGIM may request evidence of previous race participation and completion, including race results, completion certificates, Strava activities or other supporting documents.
- 5.3. The Medic Runner confirms that the selected race category is not their first half marathon or marathon experience, where the Medic Runner is participating in the Half Marathon or Marathon category.
- 5.4. Unsuccessful applicants who have already registered for either the Half Marathon or Marathon category may remain registered in their chosen race category, subject to the standard Event registration terms and conditions.

6. Training Requirements

- 6.1. The Medic Runner shall attend all mandatory training, refresher sessions, briefings and operational walk-throughs required by SGIM and/or SGIM's appointed medical provider.
- 6.2. Failure to attend or complete any mandatory training or briefing may result in SGIM removing the Medic Runner from the programme, converting the Medic Runner to a standard race participant, cancelling any complimentary entry, withholding or withdrawing any refund or entitlement, or taking such other action as SGIM considers appropriate.

7. Race-Day Role

- 7.1. The Medic Runner shall:
 - (a) provide basic first-aid assistance only within the limits of their training, certification, qualifications and SGIM's race-day protocols;
 - (b) escalate all medical incidents in accordance with SGIM's race-day procedures;

- (c) comply with all reasonable directions from SGIM, event officials and SGIM's appointed medical provider;
- (d) prioritise participant safety, incident response, escalation, handover and all Medic Runner duties over personal race timing, race performance, personal best, ranking, completion goals or any other personal sporting objective;
- (e) defer to professional medical personnel whenever they are present or available; and
- (f) stop providing assistance if directed to do so by SGIM, event officials, SGIM's appointed medical provider or emergency services.
- (g) familiarise themselves with all equipment, race-day procedures, escalation procedures and communication channels issued by SGIM and/or SGIM's appointed medical provider.
- (h) promptly report any medical incident through SGIM's approved communication channels;
- (i) provide clear handover to SGIM's appointed medical provider, event officials, ambulance services or emergency services where required;
- (j) complete any incident report reasonably required by SGIM; and
- (k) keep their mobile phone or communication device sufficiently charged and accessible during the race, where required by SGIM.

7.2. The Medic Runner acknowledges that they are participating in the Medic Runners Programme primarily to support race-day safety, and not to race for time, personal best, ranking or competitive performance. If there is any conflict between the Medic Runner's personal race objectives and their Medic Runner duties, the Medic Runner's duties shall take priority.

7.3. The Medic Runner may be required to slow down, stop, wait, assist, observe, report, escalate, remain with a participant, hand over to SGIM's appointed medical provider, event officials, ambulance services or emergency services, or otherwise act in accordance with SGIM's race-day protocols, even if doing so affects the Medic Runner's race timing, result, ranking or ability to complete the race.

7.4. The Medic Runner shall not make any claim against SGIM arising from any delay, loss of timing, loss of result, loss of ranking, inability to achieve a personal best or inability to complete the race as a result of performing or being required to perform Medic Runner duties.

8. Scope Limits

8.1. Unless expressly authorised by SGIM's appointed Medical Director, Chief Physician or Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and permitted by law, the Medic Runner shall not:

- (a) diagnose any medical condition;
- (b) provide advanced medical treatment;

- (c) administer medication;
- (d) transport an injured or unwell participant;
- (e) perform any intervention beyond their training, certification or professional qualifications;
- (f) continue assistance where doing so would create an unreasonable risk to themselves or others; or
- (g) represent that they are acting as SGIM's appointed medical provider.

9. Confidentiality and Incident Information

- 9.1. The Medic Runner may become aware of confidential, personal, medical or incident-related information relating to participants, spectators, volunteers, staff or other persons during the Event.
- 9.2. The Medic Runner shall not photograph, film, record, post, publish, share or disclose any injured, distressed or medically compromised person, or any medical incident, except where required for SGIM-approved incident reporting or where directed by SGIM, SGIM's appointed medical provider, event officials, ambulance services or emergency services.
- 9.3. The Medic Runner shall only record or report incident-related information through SGIM-approved communication channels and incident reporting processes. The Medic Runner shall not retain, use or disclose such information for any personal, social media, commercial, publicity or other unauthorised purpose.

10. Equipment and Uniform

- 10.1. The Medic Runner shall wear the official Medic Runner apparel, vest, identification and/or other items issued or required by SGIM during race participation.
- 10.2. Any equipment issued by SGIM shall be used only for Event-related purposes and shall be returned if SGIM designates it as returnable property. The Medic Runner shall take reasonable care of issued equipment and may be responsible for deliberate damage, misuse or loss.
- 10.3. Unless otherwise notified by SGIM, equipment, uniform and operational items shall be issued according to the following timeline:
 - (a) Pre-Event:
SGIM may issue the Medic Runner with acceptance confirmation, training details, briefing materials, race-day protocols, deployment information, communication instructions and such other operational information as SGIM considers necessary before the Event.
 - (b) On Event Day:
SGIM may issue the Medic Runner with the Medic Runner vest, identification, first-aid supplies, communication instructions and any other equipment or operational items required for the Medic Runner's assigned duties. Unless otherwise notified by SGIM, such items shall

be issued only upon race-day check-in or at such other time and location determined by SGIM.

(c) Post-Event:

The Medic Runner shall return all returnable equipment, vest, identification, unused supplies and other returnable items at check-out, or within such other timeline notified by SGIM. Any additional post-Event items, recognition items or certificates may be issued only after SGIM confirms that the Medic Runner has successfully completed all required duties.

- 10.4. SGIM may withhold, withdraw or refuse to issue any equipment, uniform, supplies, operational items, post-Event recognition item, certificate or other item if the Medic Runner fails to attend mandatory training or briefing, fails to report for duty, fails to complete the assigned Medic Runner duties, fails to return any returnable equipment, breaches these Terms and Conditions, or is removed from the programme.
- 10.5. SGIM may require the Medic Runner to return, and SGIM may recover, any equipment, uniform, apparel, identification, supplies or other items already issued if the Medic Runner withdraws from the programme, fails to attend mandatory training or briefing, fails to report for duty, fails to complete the assigned Medic Runner duties, breaches these Terms and Conditions, or is removed from the programme.
- 10.6. Where any equipment, uniform, apparel, identification, supplies or other item cannot be returned in its original condition, has been used, lost, damaged or not returned within the timeline required by SGIM, SGIM may require the Medic Runner to reimburse SGIM for the reasonable replacement value or cost of such item.

11. Complimentary Entry, Refunds and Entitlements

- 11.1. Successful Medic Runners shall receive entry into their assigned race category, subject to these Terms and Conditions and SGIM's operational requirements.
- 11.2. Where a successful Medic Runner has already paid for their race registration, SGIM may refund the applicable registration fee within seven (7) working days after the end of the Event, provided that the Medic Runner has successfully completed all required Medic Runner duties, including mandatory training, race-day reporting, race-day deployment, equipment return and any required incident reporting.
- 11.3. Where a successful Medic Runner has not registered for the Event, SGIM may issue a complimentary race entry or bib for the assigned race category. The Medic Runner acknowledges that such complimentary entry or bib is issued for the purpose of participating in the Medic Runners Programme and may be cancelled or withdrawn if the Medic Runner fails to comply with these Terms and Conditions.
- 11.4. SGIM may determine the timing and manner in which race entitlements, Medic Runner entitlements, certificates, additional items, benefits or recognition are issued. Unless otherwise determined by SGIM, any additional Medic Runner entitlements shall only be issued after successful completion of the Medic Runner's duties.

- 11.5. SGIM may withhold, withdraw, disqualify or cancel any complimentary entry, refund, entitlement, certificate, benefit or other item if the Medic Runner:
- (a) withdraws from the programme;
 - (b) fails to complete mandatory training or briefing;
 - (c) fails to report for duty;
 - (d) fails to complete the assigned Medic Runner duties;
 - (e) fails to return the necessary returnable equipment;
 - (f) provides false or misleading information;
 - (g) breaches these Terms and Conditions; or
 - (h) is removed from the programme for any reason.
- 11.6. If SGIM removes or reassigns a Medic Runner for operational, safety, medical, course or programme reasons without fault on the part of the Medic Runner, SGIM may determine whether the Medic Runner remains eligible for any refund, complimentary entry, race entitlement or other benefit.
- 11.7. SGIM may require the Medic Runner to return, and SGIM may recover, any race entitlements, Medic Runner entitlements, apparel, equipment, items, benefits or other materials issued before race day if the Medic Runner withdraws from the programme, fails to attend mandatory training or briefing, fails to report for duty, fails to complete the assigned Medic Runner duties, breaches these Terms and Conditions, or is removed from the programme.
- 11.8. Where any such entitlement, item or material cannot be returned in its original condition, has been used, lost, damaged or not returned within the timeline required by SGIM, SGIM may require the Medic Runner to reimburse SGIM for the reasonable replacement value or cost of such entitlement, item or material.

12. Withdrawal and Removal

- 12.1. SGIM may remove a Medic Runner from the programme at any time if:
- (a) the Medic Runner no longer meets the eligibility requirements;
 - (b) any certification expires or is not verified before race day;
 - (c) the Medic Runner fails to attend mandatory training or briefings;
 - (d) the Medic Runner breaches programme rules or race-day protocols;
 - (e) SGIM considers the Medic Runner's conduct unsafe, inappropriate, misleading or detrimental to the Event;

- (f) medical advice indicates that the Medic Runner should not undertake the role; or
- (g) removal is required for operational, safety, medical, legal or regulatory reasons.

13. Assumption of Risk

- 13.1. The Medic Runner acknowledges that participation involves the usual risks of distance running and the additional risks of responding to injured, distressed or medically compromised participants. These risks may include exposure to blood, bodily fluids, vomit, heat-related illness, physical contact, emotional distress, emergency situations and other race-day medical incidents.
- 13.2. The Medic Runner voluntarily accepts these risks and confirms that they are physically and mentally able to participate in the Event and the Medic Runners Programme.

14. Good Faith Assistance

- 14.1. SGIM acknowledges that Medic Runners may be required to make reasonable, good-faith judgments in time-sensitive race-day situations.
- 14.2. Provided that the Medic Runner acts in good faith, within the scope of their training, certification, qualifications and SGIM's race-day protocols, SGIM shall not treat the Medic Runner as being in breach of these Terms and Conditions solely because the outcome of any first-aid assistance is unsuccessful.
- 14.3. Nothing in this clause protects a Medic Runner from liability arising from fraud, wilful misconduct, reckless conduct, gross negligence, unlawful acts, or actions outside the scope of their training, certification, qualifications or SGIM's race-day protocols.

15. Indemnity

- 15.1. The Medic Runner shall indemnify SGIM, its directors, officers, employees, contractors, sponsors, partners, stakeholders, event officials and appointed medical provider against claims, losses, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses arising from:
 - (a) the Medic Runner's breach of these Terms and Conditions;
 - (b) false, inaccurate or misleading information provided by the Medic Runner;
 - (c) the Medic Runner acting outside the scope of their training, certification, qualifications or SGIM's race-day protocols;
 - (d) the Medic Runner's fraud, wilful misconduct, reckless conduct, gross negligence or unlawful act; or
 - (e) misuse of SGIM materials, equipment, uniform, branding or confidential information.

16. Insurance

16.1. The Medic Runner acknowledges that any insurance coverage made available by SGIM shall be subject to the terms, conditions, exclusions and limits of the applicable insurance policy.

16.2. Nothing in this document guarantees that SGIM's insurance will cover every loss, injury, claim, cost or liability arising from the Medic Runner's participation in the Event or the Medic Runners Programme.

17. Data Protection

17.1. The Medic Runner consents to SGIM collecting, using and disclosing their personal data, certification records, race experience, emergency contact details, medical declarations and programme-related information for the purposes of assessing eligibility, administering the Medic Runners Programme, verifying qualifications, planning deployment, managing safety, responding to incidents, and coordinating with SGIM Operations, the SGIM Medical Team, Lentor Medical and relevant service providers.

17.2. SGIM shall handle personal data in accordance with applicable data protection laws.

18. Media Consent

18.1. The Medic Runner consents to being photographed, filmed and recorded during training, briefings, race-week activities and race-day participation. SGIM may use the Medic Runner's name, image, likeness, voice, photograph, video, testimonial and programme participation for Event, programme, publicity, media, archival and promotional purposes without additional payment.
